



NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES



POSTED PURSUANT TO A SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT APPROVED BY A REGIONAL DIRECTOR OF THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD

AN AGENCY OF THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT

FEDERAL LAW GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO:

- Form, join, or assist a union;
- Choose a representative to bargain with us on your behalf;
- Act together with other employees for your benefit and protection;
- Choose not to engage in any of these protected activities.

WE WILL NOT do anything to prevent you from exercising the above rights and will allow the distribution of union literature in non-work areas.

WE WILL NOT create the impression of surveillance of union activities.

WE WILL NOT threaten you by telling you that the United Steelworkers of America ("Steelworkers") can't help you, can't fix your problems, you will get nothing or lose as a result of negotiations, and nothing will change if you unionize.

WE WILL NOT threaten you by telling you that you will lose money if you unionize because you will have to pay dues or that the Company will lose customers if you unionize.

WE WILL NOT threaten you by telling you that unions do not make companies healthy or productive and profitability decreases when employees unionize.

WE WILL NOT threaten you by telling you pensions are a strike issue for the Steelworkers.

WE WILL NOT threaten you by telling you the Steelworkers will trade employee benefits to get a union security clause, or that the Steelworkers will retaliate against you or have you fired if you try to get rid of the Union.

WE WILL NOT interfere with your rights under Section 7 of the National Labor Relations Act.
